Sunday, May 5, is Easter (or Pascha) for Orthodox Christians. Pr. Bill will be leading any interested participants from Good Shepherd to attend the Paschal liturgy at St. George Greek Orthodox Church in Knoxville the night of Saturday, May 4. We will meet at Good Shepherd at 8:30 pm for a brief class on "What to Expect" from an Orthodox liturgy. From there, we will proceed to Knoxville and St. George's for the liturgy, which begins at 11:00 pm.

NOTE: This is a long and late service! Orthodox services can easily go for two hours or more, and a meal to break the Lenten fast will be served afterwards. We will plan to stay for that.
