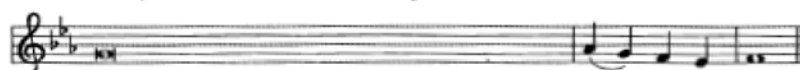

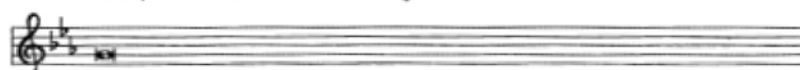

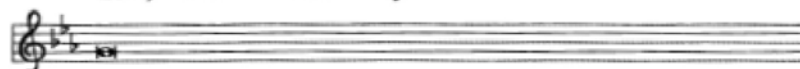

Send us forth, burning with justice, peace, and love.
