EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

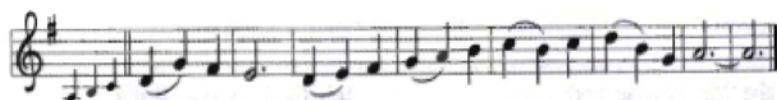
P: You are indeed holy, almighty and merciful God.
