## For The Children's Sake

Pictured above are a few of the many Christian teachers and leaders whose task it is to educate our children in public and private schools. They are not only interested in their work, but are concerned about the relation of their Christian faith to that work. Does a teacher have one set of responsibilities as a teacher and another as a Christian? How can the children be assured of receiving Christian values from the teacher without formal religious instruction?

The leaders in the picture sought answers to such questions at a Conference for Public and Private School Leaders held at Gustavus Adolphus College, St. Peter, Minnesota, last summer. A similar conference will be held this summer at Wittenberg University, Springfield, Ohio, from August 4 to 11. Those who attend will engage in Bible study, worship, theological discussion, personal relationships. These activities will be brought to bear upon their relations with their pupils, with

faculty and administrative workers in the schools, with boards of administration, parents, community groups. Christian attitudes and action patterns will be set up under the guidance of capable conference leaders like those pictured below who served in 1961.

Since the aim of the conference is to reach a specialized group, only public and private school teachers, superintendents, principals, supervisors, counselors, nurses, librarians, coaches, dietitians, custodians and other persons engaged in school work may attend. No provisions can be made for children or other members of the family. Only those who can attend for the entire week will be accepted.
